1. Robert Finley Hawkins House, c.1845 Federal style Residence, R.F Hawkins (1834-1921) was fifth generation Hawkins in Yaphank

**3. Robinson-Mills-Tuthill House**, 1726 Dutch Colonial style, oldest known dwelling in Yaphank, built for Captain Robinson, established first mill in 1739

4. Samuel F. Norton House, 1846 Greek Revival Style Relocated in 1974 from Main Street and Mill Road

**5. Swezey-Davis House**, c.1800 Long Island Half- house

**6. Swezey-Avey House** on mid-18<sup>th</sup> Century Mill Site. Early part of house Pre-Revolutionary, later addition 1840's. Now Town of Brookhaven property. Headquarters of the Yaphank Historical Society

7. Swezey Saw Mill Historic Marker, Burned down in 1914

**8. Yaphank Common**Established by Town of

9. Nehemiah Óverton House, 1861 10. Sereno B. Overton House, 1860

Butcher shop and residence in 1860's

11. Homan-Marchant House, c.1863

Home of Justice of the Peace, Frederick Marchant

12. Presbyterian Parsonage, 1874

13. Yaphank Presbyterian Church and Cemetery site, 1851. Destroyed by fire 2013.

**14. Walters House** c.1873 Site of flower bulb farm, 1930's.

**15. Dr. James Baker House**, c.1776 Established medical practice in Yaphank in 1860's

**16. Dr Henry S. Holden House**, c.1820 Originally from England, physician at Suffolk County Alms House

17. Charles E. Marvin House and Carriage Barn, c. 1875. Mr. Marvin, carriage maker of stagecoaches and wagonettes

**18. Hulse House**, c.1873

19. Yaphank Grange Hall #1349, c.1900 Used as enlisted men's club during WWI and WWII. Later a clock factory, now a bank.

**20. Horace S. Overton House**, 1860

21. Yaphank School, 1926
Replaced an earlier octagonal

Replaced an earlier octagonal school built in 1854.

22. Samuel Smith House, c.1858

23. Yaphank Cemetery Association, 1872.

**24. Richard Homan House**, c.1728 **25. Sylvester Homan House**, c.1850

**29. Stroud House**, 1928. Sears Roebuck kit house Barn moved from Camp Upton after WWI.

**30. Homan-Hawkins House**, 1757 Formerly Whitman Rabbitry

**31.** Augustus Floyd House, ć.1860 Home of grandson of William Floyd, signer of Declaration of Independence. Later, general store and community shop.

**32. De La Marca-Kovarik House**, c.1850 Home of NYC opera singer/vocal teacher in early 1900's Originally part of Augustus Floyd complex. Relocated from original site to rear of Post Office

**33. Hammond House**, c.1844 Home of scenic view photographer Ed Hammond Produced Yaphank scenic postcards

**34.** Charles E. Howell Store, 1844
Relocated from original site, now private residence

35. St. Andrews Episcopal Church and Cemetery, 1853. Listed on The National Register of Historic Places

**36. Yaphank Garage**, 1937 Built by Leslie R. Marchant for Sheridan and Ehrenwirth, now Suffolk County Police Historical Society.

**38. Gray Cottage**, 1942

Built as gameskeeper's cottage by Leslie R. Marchant

**39. Homan-Gerard House**, c.1790, Federal style Adjacent to Homan Mill site, 1762 Listed on The National Register of Historic Places

**40. Carmans River Nature Trail**, Cranberry Lake/Weeks Pond

**41. Buckingham-Homan Family Cemetery**, c. 1814

**42. Mary L. Booth House**, c.1829
Birthplace of famed abolitionist, suffragist, author of the first history of the city of New York, founding editor of *Harper's Bazar*.
Listed on The National Register of Historic Places
